

Alice Zimet will conduct this fun, social workshop focusing on the beginner basics of collecting, with a particular spotlight on the PRC 2011 Benefit Auction pieces. Karen Haas, the Lane Collection Curator of Photographs at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, will lead a tour of highlights from the live auction during which attendees will learn about several prominent local artists. Attendees will gain a greater understanding of the photography marketplace and the proper tools to become a thoughtful photography collector. Workshop topics include:

- issues to consider before collecting
- · where to look and buy
- pricing
- galleries and auction houses
- profit vs. nonprofit resources
- buyers' responsibilities

Attendees will also have the opportunity to mingle with other emerging and established collectors while getting an exclusive sneak preview of the PRC's live auction. Wine and hors d'ouevres provided. This workshop is not to be missed!

Zimet began to collect photography in 1985. Her collection of roughly 200 images reflects both personal taste and passionate enthusiasm. She is a member of the Collections Committee of the Harvard Art Museums, a member of the International Center of Photography's Exhibitions Committee, and one of two non-photographer board members of the new Magnum Foundation. She began her career in the museum world but moved to the private sector where she founded Arts + Business Partners.

#### **Stuart Whitehurst**

Vice President, Director of Rare Books & Manuscripts, Skinner, Inc.

Stuart P. Whitehurst has over twenty-six years of experience in both Fine Books & Manuscripts and Fine & Decorative Arts. He has been with Skinner Inc. since 1995. As the director of Skinner's Fine Books & Manuscripts department, Stuart has been instrumental in establishing Skinner as a leading source for all manner of historical documents, including books, manuscripts, letters, autographs, maps and Audubon prints. Under Stuart's auspices, Skinner Fine Books and Manuscripts auctions have set a number of world records, including the record for a non-Dunlap broadside of the Declaration of Independence in 2007, and a John Wilkes Booth letter in 2004. In addition, Stuart is a renowned generalist appraiser with extensive knowledge of English, American, Continental and Chinese decorative works of art; furniture from the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries; as well as prints, armorial porcelain, and Latin American paintings. Stuart has been a favorite appraiser on the PBS series The Antiques Roadshow since its premiere in 1997, and regularly conducts appraisal days, lectures, and benefit auctions for educational and charitable organizations. Stuart has appeared on numerous New England radio and television programs, and on national programs including HGTV's At the Auction, National Public Radio's Weekend Edition, the Today show, and Ellen: The Ellen DeGeneres Show. A proud graduate of the University of Virginia, Stuart is a senior auctioneer at Skinner, and is currently an Associate Member of the International Society of Appraisers.

#### **Bidding Information**

#### Registration

In order to receive a paddle number upon entrance to the auction, all patrons must provide a credit card number to guarantee payment of any winning bids made. Actual payment at check-out may be in the form of cash, personal check, or credit card.

#### **Live Auction**

The Live Auction will proceed in numerical order as listed in this auction catalog.

#### **Silent Auction**

Bids are to be made on the bid sheet corresponding to the particular print of interest. These bid sheets will be adjacent to the prints on the night of the Silent Auction. The Silent Auction sections will close in increments of 20 minutes beginning at 9:00 pm. At the conclusion of each section, volunteers will circle the winning bid and paddle number.

#### **Absentee Bids**

Collectors are invited to bid on live and silent artwork in the auction without being present the night of the auction. To place an absentee bid, please contact Erin Wederbrook Yuskaitis, Program and Events Manager, at ewyuskaitis@prcboston.org or at 617-975-0600. Absentee bids will be accepted until 5 pm on Wednesday, October 12. Absentee bids will be executed at the lowest possible price, subject to the reserve price and other bids. If two or more parties have entered matching bids, the earliest shall take preference.

#### **Buy It Now Option**

All work in the silent auction may be purchased outright at 125% of the list price. The Buy It Now option will still be available the night of the auction, but this option is only available if the last bid does not exceed the Buy It Now price. We request that all Buy it Now purchases remain on display until October 15.

#### **Paddle Raise**

For this year's paddle raise, the PRC respectfully requests support for its core program—exhibitions. While your support during the entire auction will aid the PRC in covering its operating expenses, we want to—we need to—make a concerted effort to raise funds to support specifically our exhibitions, which make up the largest part of the PRC's budget. We currently ask artists to cover an enormous portion of printing, framing, and shipping costs, and as an organization that promotes photographers and their work, we aim to cover these costs ourself. A typical show's expenses involve the production of postcards and posters, mailing, supplies such as paint, installation, and travel expenses, in addition to the aforementioned printing, framing, and shipping of the work. People who raise their paddles for this cause will be listed as Exhibition Donors in our gallery during the 2012 exhibition season. Help us continue to foster New England photography through the essential practice of showcasing work in our gallery. Thank you!

#### **Conditions of Sale**

Items will be offered for sale in the same order in which they are listed in this catalog. The prints in this auction have been matted and framed before the sale for protection and presentation. We make no representation as to condition of any lot sold except where noted in this catalog, and generally no reference to imperfection is made in the catalog description. All lots are sold as is. Perspective purchasers should personally view lots to evaluate their condition.

The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The auctioneer has the right to reject a bid and to advance the bidding at his absolute discretion, and in the event of dispute, to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer and resell the article in dispute. On the fall of the auctioneer's gavel, title of the offered lot shall pass to the buyer, who shall forthwith assume full risk and responsibility for the purchase, supply his or her name and address, and pay the full purchase price. Should there be any dispute after the sale, the auctioneer's record of final sale shall be conclusive

Estimates are furnished only as a service to prospective bidders. They signify the appropriate price range that we expect each lot to realize. These estimates have been prepared well in advance and are subject to change. If a lot is subject to a reserve (a confidential minimum price below which the lot will not be sold), we will implement reserve bidding on behalf of the consignor. Consignors are not allowed to bid on their own items.

All purchases must be paid in full the day of the auction. Payment may be made in the form of cash, personal check, or credit card. We will add the Massachusetts state sales tax to all in-state purchases.

As noted above, all of the artworks in the PRC 2011 Benefit Auction are framed. The PRC will wrap and pack purchased lots, but shipment may be arranged only at the request and cost of the purchaser. Volunteers will be available at the auction to assist patrons with loading their vehicles. Purchases must be picked up at the PRC by 5 pm on Friday, October 28, 2011. The PRC is not responsible for storing purchases beyond that date.

#### **Photographic Glossary**

The following descriptions explain the terminology used in this catalog. Please note that statements and terms in this catalog are subject to provisions of the Conditions of Sale and that the Photographic Resource Center makes no warranties or representations with any lot.

**Authorship:** The name in bold type indicates the photographer who, in our best judgment, is the author of the work (no unqualified statement regarding authorship is made or intended). If not of the collection of the artist, donor is indicated.

**Title:** The title, either as given by the photographer or by which the image is generally known, appears in italics.

**Date:** In this catalog, the date refers to the year the image was created, not necessarily when the piece was printed. In every instance, the PRC has used dates provided by the artists.

**Measurement:** Given in inches, this generally refers to the image size. The PRC has used sizes provided by the artists.

**Edition:** Indicates the number of prints made of the particular image and where this particular print falls within the series. For example, 3/15 indicates that the photograph is the 3rd print out of an edition of 15. AP stands for Artist's Proof.

**Condition:** In this catalog, the PRC has made no attempt to qualitatively describe the condition of the photographs and makes no guarantees regarding their condition.

#### **Fashion**

While the PRC's mission focuses on photography, we want our members and supporters to know that we embrace and celebrate all the arts. The work of two recent graduates of the Massachusetts College of Art + Design will be featured during the live and silent auctions.



#### **Gillian Wright**

Gillian Wright's collection, *Las Mujeres*, is a mixture of large Cuban style prints, bright, saturated color, leather, and hardware. A unique mixture of military influences and soft feminine silhouettes captures the idea of influential, strong women within Cuban history. The juxtaposition of military activism and societal expectations of women in the 1960s plays into a line that fully embraces womanliness while examining the Cuban revolution and politics.



#### Nataliya Yermolenko

Uprising is a striking ready-to-wear collection inspired by the stage presence and lifestyle of the United Kingdom musical group Muse. The work evokes the grand demeanor and mood of the Rock Alternative trio through the use of leathers, furs, textured wools, and metallic ornamentation. Although Muse is an all-male trio, the musicians inspired a women's-wear collection comprised of carefully tailored jackets and coats, which conve-

niently intermixes with intricate form-fitting undergarments. These ensembles are bold, stark, and alluring and leave the woman feeling nothing short of a rock star.

#### **Installation**

In addition to stellar photography, the auction will also feature work from TRIIIBE's exhibition *In Search of Eden, A Work in Progress.* TRIIIBE's 10 x 14 foot triptychs play with religious and advertising imagery, revisiting the biblical creation story, the notion of temptation, and the eternal quest for Eden.

Elsa Dorfman has produced personal and commercial portrait photographs of what she calls "affection and survival." She uses a special oversized Polaroid camera, one of only six worldwide, to create very large prints (23" x 23"). In 1974, she assembled and



published *Elsa's Housebook—A Woman's Photojournal*, a collection of informal portraits of friends and houseguests including Allen Ginsberg, Robert Creeley, and Laurence Ferlinghetti, among others. She now works in New York and Cambridge.

Carl Chiarenza is Artist in Residence and Fanny Knapp Allen Professor Emeritus of Art History at the University of Rochester. Chiarenza has lectured and taught at institutions across the United States. His



photographic work has been seen in more than eighty solo exhibitions and more than two hundred and fifty group exhibitions since the late 1950s. His critical biography, *Aaron Siskind: Pleasures and Terrors,* received a 1983 Merit Award from the Photographic Historical Society. He has developed and guided numerous organizations devoted to photographic arts and was a founding board member of the PRC.

Harold Edgerton invented stop-action, high-speed photography, helping push the obscure stroboscope from a laboratory instrument into a household item. He used this technique to make a body of work that's revered both for its scientific advancement and its aesthetic qualities. Edgerton received numerous




awards for his invention, and in 1995, the Harold E. Edgerton Educational Center in Cambridge was established posthumously. He died in Cambridge on January 4, 1990.

John Goodman's photographs can be found among the collections of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, Metropolitan Museum of Art, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and Art Institute of Chicago. The Newton, MA native has shot for numerous national magazines and fashion houses over the course of his thirty-

year career. A student of the seminal abstract expressionist Minor White, Goodman dabbled in abstraction before earning his reputation for revelatory portraiture.

William Wegman was born in Holyoke, MA in 1943. Wegman attended the Massachusetts College of Art + Design in Boston, later receiving his MFA from University of Illinois in 1967. In 1970, Wegman acquired Man Ray, the dog with whom he began a fruitful twelve-



year collaboration. Man Ray became a central figure in Wegman's photography and videos, known in the art world and beyond for his endearing deadpan presence. Upon Wegman's move to New York in 1972, his work garnered him a "Man of the Year" award from the New York City newspaper the Village Voice. A retrospective of his work traveled to museums throughout Europe and the United States, including the Whitney Museum of American Art. His most recent exhibitions have gone to Japan, Sweden, and the Orange County Museum of Art in California. Wegman now lives in New York and Maine.

Marie Cosindas trained as a painter but during the early 1960s she took photography workshops with masters such as Ansel Adams and Minor White. Cosindas' work played a vital role in establishing the use of color in fine art photography during the 1960s, and her



solo show at the Museum of Modern Art in 1966 was one of the institution's first to feature color photography.

Henry Horenstein has worked as a photographer, teacher, and author since the early 1970s. He has authored over 30 books, including many monographs (Honky Tonk, Humans, Creatures, Aquatics, Canine, Racing Days). Henry's textbooks have been widely used by thousands of photography students over past thirty years. He lives in Boston where he continues to photograph, exhibit, publish, and teach at the Rhode Island School of Design, as a professor of photography. His work is collected by many institutions including the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History, George Eastman House, and Museum of Fine Arts, Boston.

Lydia Panas is the recipient of many awards and honors including First Place for the Publisher's Choice Award at CENTER, Santa Fe (2009). She was one of nine artists included in the International Discoveries at Fotofest 2008 as well as Photography Now at the Center for Photography at Woodstock 2006. Her work was recently included in 100 Photographers at the Corcoran Gallery of Art. Lydia received degrees from Boston College, School of Visual Arts, NYU/International Center of Photography and completed a Whitney Museum Independent Study Fellowship. Lydia has taught photography for over twenty years for institutions such as the Museum of Modern Art, the Guggenheim, and Maine Media Workshops. Her work will be included in the prestigious American Photography 27 for 2011.

Susan Meiselas received her BA from Sarah Lawrence College and her MA in visual education from Harvard University. Her first major photographic essay, *Carnival Strippers*, focused on the lives of women doing striptease at New England country fairs. Meiselas joined Magnum Photos in 1976 and has worked as a freelance photographer since then. She is best known for her coverage of the insurrection in Nicaragua and her documentation of human rights issues in Latin America. Meiselas has had solo exhibitions in Paris, Madrid, Amsterdam, London, Los Angeles, Chicago, and New York. Honorary awards of recognition include: the Robert Capa Gold Medal by the Overseas Press Club (1979); the Leica Award for Excellence (1982); the Hasselblad Foundation Photography Prize (1994); and most recently, the Cornell Capa Infinity Award (2005). In 1992, she was named a MacArthur Fellow.

Sally Mann was born in 1951 in Lexington, Virginia, where she continues



to live and work. She received her BA from Hollins College in 1974 and a MA in writing in 1975. Her early series of photographs of her three children and husband resulted in a much-glorified yet controversial series called *Immediate Family*. Mann has released eight books and has won numerous awards, including Guggenheim and National Endowment for the Arts fellowships. Her photographs are in the permanent collections of many museums, including the Museum of Modern Art; the Whitney Museum of American Art; and the Smithsonian American Art Museum.

After graduating from Wellesley College in 1963 with a degree in Art History, Olivia Parker began her career as a painter. She became intrigued with photography in 1970. Mostly self-taught in photography, Parker makes beautiful constructions of objects to be photographed using formats ranging from 35mm to Polaroid. August Sander was born in Herdorf, near Cologne, Germany, the son of a mining carpenter. He received a 13 x 18 cm camera from an uncle in 1892. In 1903, he started the August Sander Studio for Pictorial Arts of Photography and Painting. Sander was awarded a gold medal and Cross of Honor at the



Paris Exposition of 1904, the first of hundreds of such awards he would receive in his career. Shortly after, he began to experiment with color photography and his work in this field was soon acquired by the Leipzig Museum. In 1906, Sander's first solo exhibition of 100 prints was held at the Landhaus Pavilon in Linz. Sander served in the German Army during World War I but continued to photograph. He began teaching in 1919. Sander suffered a stroke in late 1963 and died in Cologne some months later.
