Theme: **"Between Dusk and Dawn: Photographing the Night"**

Do you photograph at night and explore its various permutations? Then sign up to present your work at this nocturnal-themed Nights. How our experience changes in the absence of natural light, as well as in the presence of artificial illumination, can reveal a world transformed. Tourlentes received his MFA from MassArt, where he is currently a Visiting Professor. In his ongoing series "Of Length and Measures," he captures prisons at night; selections were shown in the Metropolitan Museum of Art's 2011 exhibition, "Night Vision: Photography After Dark." An ICA Boston Foster Prize finalist, Tourlentes has received many awards

and grants, including Guggenheim and Artadia fellowships, and his work is held in numerous museum collections.

EXPOSURE: The 20th Annual PRC Juried Exhibition - April 28 – June 26, 2016 - Opening: Thursday, May 5th, 5:30-8pm

The PRC presents a **special version of EXPOSURE in honor of the 20th iteration of its renowned juried show and the PRC's 40th anniversary year.** To honor these milestones, the PRC sought a chorus of voices, rather than its usual solo juror, and asked five former PRC Curators and Directors of Exhibitions to jury this year's exhibition, collectively: Anita Douthat, John Jacob, Leslie K. Brown, George Slade, and Francine Weiss. This esteemed group represents close to 30 years of PRC exhibition history as well a collection of impressive current positions as well. Known for identifying new trends and showcasing several works from each of the ten to fifteen selected photographers, EXPOSURE showcases the present and celebrates the future. The deadline was in early February and the featured photographers will be announced in March.
